Construction Documents Technology (CDT)

With CDT after your name, you'll belong to a select and highly respected group on construction professionals—architects, contractors, contract administrators, specifiers, manufacturer representatives—known in the industry for their comprehensive knowledge of the writing and management of construction documents. CDT Candidates must demonstrate knowledge of CSI's recommended practices in construction process, contractual relationships, and use of construction documents.

Certified Construction Specifier (CCS)

Well-written documents are the best insurance policy for any construction project, making your role as a specifier more and more critical. CCS certification demonstrates your excellence in specifications and contract document preparation and is the industry's proof that you're on top of the complex demands of your job. CCS candidates must demonstrate knowledge in contractual relationships, document organization, and document preparation.

Certified Construction Contract Administrator (CCCA)

The CCCA designation tells the industry that you truly understand all facets of the construction process and contractual relationships, and that you're skilled at construction contract administration in an era of complex projects, tighter delivery schedules, and shrinking budgets. CCCA candidates must demonstrate knowledge in construction contract administration, preconstruction activities and procedures, construction phase activities, construction observation procedures, and project closeout processes.

Certified Construction Product Representative (CCPR)

Product representatives are a vital source of technical information for the construction team. CCPR on your business card means you speak the same language as architects, engineers, specifiers, contractors, and other decision-makers—and that opens doors. CCPR candidates must demonstrate knowledge in construction product representation, preparation of construction documents, use of construction documents and the construction process.

Prepare For Your Exam

CSI Exams require substantive preparation, even for experienced professionals. CSI can't guarantee you'll pass your exam, but we can recommend approaches that fit your schedule. All successful candidates start with a copy of CSI's free study guide and appropriate reference documents. Many more candidates take their preparation to the next level by registering for a CSI chapter prep program or CSI's web-based CDT program. Last, tap into the CSI member community to gain the support of a mentor who's already passed the exam.
